INDEPENDENCE DAY July 4th


America celebrates July 4 as Independence Day because it was on July 4, 1776, that

On June 4th, Both my husband, Jerry and I flew to New York City to meet Jerrye Ray of Baton Rouge, LA at JFK Airport. Then we departed at 8:30 p.m. and arrived Reykjavik, Iceland "next morning" at 6:00 a.m. The hour difference between Austin and Iceland is 5 hours. Upon our arrival, we hitched a bus ride to Iceland's most visited attractions, Blue Lagoon.

The warm water are rich in minerals like silica and sulfur and the water temperature in the bathing and swimming area of the lagoon averages 104f.

After swimming and relaxing for 3 hours, the bus stayed and waited for us and others to drop us off to our hotel. We stayed at the apartment in Old Harbour ("Downtown") area which was easily accessed for us all to explore around the Capitol city of Iceland on foot.

June 6th, we went to visit the Deaf Center and met some Icelandic deaf people. We were very lucky to stop by because they had Open House from 2 p.m. to 4 p.m. which meant more deaf people coming by for social. To our relief, we were able to chat with them using some gestures and ASL. After the social at the Center, we headed to Perian, in English it means The Pearl. It is one of the landmarks in Reykjavik for its six huge storage tanks for hot water from the geo-thermal springs. The water is

used for heating the houses and other uses as bath water or drink water. There are some little gift shops, Saga Musuem, and a restaurant with an excellent view of the city.

June 7th, Day bus tour to the geyser, the waterfull, Pingviller National Park and the green houses where they grow their vegetables, plants, flowers, etc. We enjoyed the trip at same time we have learned a lot about Iceland.

Reykjavik...rode 8-10, Departed "Greyhound" bus to Akureyri, 2nd largest urban area in northern part of Iceland with a population of 17,000. The purpose of visit to this town was to see more the countryside, farmlands. marshlands. Icelandic sheep and horses also to satisfy our desire to get a certificate for visiting the Arctic Circle in Grimsley Island. However, Mother Nature prevented us from flying to Arctic Circle due to heavy fog and ride Icelandic horses (chilly and wet weather).

June 11, The sun finally shone and warmed us on our last day in Iceland. Did some last minute shopping, etc before catching a plane back to NYC.

RECIPE AMISH MACARONI SALAD

Yield 20 servings:

1 lb. Macaroni small elbows or baby sea shells

1/2 cup Celery, chopped finely

1/2 cup Carrots, finely grated

1/4 cup Onions, finely chopped or add little more if desired (I use Shallots.)

6 Hard cooked eggs, chopped coarsley Paprika, seasoning on top of the salad

1 (12-oz.) Spam, cut into cubes or 2 cans of Hormel Ham (5-oz.), if desired

Cook macaroni as direction; drain and cool. (Be sure to put little bit of olive oil to mix them to keep from sticky.)

Set aside 1 hard cooked egg; then stir together gently the cooked macaroni, celery, carrots, onion, and the remaining eggs.

DRESSING:

1 pint Hellmann's Mayonnaise or less or more to taste

Zesty Italian Dressing to taste

Mix all together and the last to mix with Zesty Italian Dressing lightly mixed for more flavoring before serving.

Blend together; then fold innto macaroni salad mixture.

Garnish with the hard cooked egg and paprika.

(Note: You can use green onions instead of any onion if desired.)
