FACT OF THE DAY: US Capital

For a short time, starting on September 13, 1788, New York City was the location of the new U.S. government in place of Philadelphia. In 1790, the capital moved back to Philadelphia for 10 years before moving permanently to Washington, D.C.

DEAFHISTORY – Looking Back:

Year 1879 — Henry Eustace McCulloch was forced to resign from his position as superintendent of Texas School for the Deaf. McCulloch, who knew nothing about the deaf and deafness, was appointed to this position few years earlier as a political reward for favors carried out in his political career. PLAYER DIES AFTER GAME WITH DEAF SCHOOL: Vinnie Rodriguez, a football

player for Boron (Calif.) High School, died last Tuesday from a head injury suffered September 12 in a game against the California School for the Deaf Riverside. The 16-year-old sophomore running back made what observers called a routine tackle before returning to the bench, toppling to the ground and suffering several seizures. The game was called and a helicopter landed on the Boron field to take Rodriguez to the hospital, but he succumbed to his injuries four days later. The Bobcats voted unanimously to play their next game, said Boron Athletic Director Jim Boghosian in the Los Angeles Times, because "that's what he would want."

RECIPE

Cornbread Broccoli

(By Virginia Ruebush)

- 2 boxes Jiffy cornbread
- 1 medium chopped onion
- 4 eggs
- 1 (8oz.) cottage cheese
- 1 Bag frozen chopped broccoli

Notable hurricanes that have hit Texas since 1900.

Sept. 24 2005: Rita hits along Texas-Louisiana border; About 100 deaths, Damage: \$4.7 billion.

Aug. 18, 1983: Alicia hits Galveston-Houston; 21 dead. Damage: \$2 billion.

Sept. 11, 1961: Carla hits Port O'Connor-Galveston; 34 dead. Damage: \$300 million.

Sept. 4, 1933: Brownsville hit; 40 dead. Damage: \$16.9 million.

Aug. 13, 1932: Velasco (Freeport) hit; 40 dead. Damage: \$7.5 million.

Sept. 14, 1919: South of Corpus Christi hit; 284 dead. Damage: 20.3 million.

Aug. 18, 1916: Corpus Christi hit; 20 dead. Damage: \$1.6 million.

Aug. 16, 1915: Galveston hit; 375 dead. Damage: More than \$56 million. Most to crops.

July 21, 1909: Velasco (Freeport) hit; 41 dead. Damage: at least 2 million.
