

Gallaudet's Lynn Ray Boren to receive USA Volleyball's Rebecca B. Howard Star Award

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo. – Gallaudet University women's volleyball head coach Lynn Ray Boren has been selected to receive the USA Volleyball (USAV) Rebecca B. Howard Star Award for his part in positively impacting diversity in the sport of volleyball. Boren will be honored at the American Volleyball Coaches Association (AVCA) Annual

Coaches Convention in Oklahoma City, Okla., at the Cox Convention Center on December 17-21. Boren has been the head women's volleyball coach at Gallaudet University for the past nine years. In nine seasons, Boren has accumulated a 227-109 career record (.676 winning percentage) with the Bison and led them to five NCAA tournament appearances and four straight North Eastern Athletic Conference (NEAC) championships. Boren has posted a 64-13 (.831 winning percentage) record in NEAC regular season matches. The Rebecca B. Howard Star Award is initiated by the Diversity Commission to identify and recognize groups and individuals who demonstrate a successful commitment to diversity in volleyball. 














RECIPE

Zucchini Deep Dish Pie By Ruby Rueffer

Crust

1 package (8 ounces) refrigerated crescent rolls

2 teaspoons Dijon mustard

Filling

4 cups thinly sliced zucchini (3-4 small)

1 cup coarsely chopped onion

2 tablespoons butter or margarine

1 garlic clove, pressed

½ teaspoon Italian seasoning

¼ teaspoon salt

¼ teaspoon ground black pepper

2 tablespoons snipped fresh parsley

2 eggs

2 cups (8 ounces) shredded mozzarella cheese *Assemble ingredients prior to recipe preparation.*

1. Preheat oven to 375F, For crust, unroll crescent dough; separate into triangles.

Arrange evenly in Deep Dish Baker with points toward the center, Using lightly floured Baker's Roller roll dough over bottom to seal seams. Press dough halfway up sides to form a crust. Spread mustard over bottom of crust.

- 2. For filling, slice zucchini using Ultimate Slice & Grate fitted with adjustable thin slicing blade. Coarsely chop onion using Food Chopper. Melt butter in Family (12-in.) Skillet over medium-high heat. Cook and stir zucchini, onion, garlic, Italian seasoning, salt and black pepper 4-5 minutes or until vegetables are crisptender. Remove from heat; stir in parsley.
- 3. Whisk eggs in Classic Batter Bowl. Stir in cheese. Add vegetable mixture; mix well. Pour vegetable mixture over crust, spreading evenly. Bake 25-30 minutes or until center is set and crust is golden brown. Cut into wedges to serve.

Yield: 8 servings


