








# BRUNSON HOME TRANSFORMED INTO A MCDONALD'S RESTAURANT





The street name was changed later that year and his address became 505 Lamar Blvd. and Barton Spring Road. About 1970, McDonald's bought the land. The house was demolished and a new hamburger restaurant with the famous Golden Arches took its place. The Brunson family loved the house when they lived there because they could walk to Zilker Park during summer. That picture with heavy snow was taken on January 31, 1949.




# Journey Through Deaf Texas



# RECIPE

# Maple Pecan Refrigerator Cookies By Rosemary McGaugh

1 cup softened butter

½ cup sugar

3 tbsp real maple syrup (not pancake syrup)

1 large egg yolk

½ tsp vanilla extract

½ tsp maple extract

2 cups flour

1 ½ cups chopped pecans

- Beat butter for 3 minutes or until creamy.
   Beat in sugar gradually. Add syrup, egg yolk, and extracts; beat well. Stir in flour and pecans.
- 2. Divide dough in half and shape into logs 2 inches in diameter. Wrap in plastic wrap or parchment paper and refrigerate until firm.
- 3. Preheat oven to 350 degrees Fahrenheit.
- Cut logs into ½ -inch thick rounds; arrange on greased cookie sheets. Bake for 18-20 minutes or until golden brown.


