



out of hospital on July 14th and went back home in San Marcos. *Get Well, Denzil!* (Submitted by Glenn Brunson)






HEARING TIGER AND DEAF TIGER

RECIPE

OATMEAL CAKE

By Wanda Butler

1 stick of butter - "I can't believe it"

1 cup brown sugar 1 1/3 cup sifted flour

1 cup white sugar 1 tsp. soda 2 eggs (beaten) 1 tsp. cinnamon 1 tsp. vanilla 1 1/2 cup water

1 cup oatmeal 1/4 tsp. salt

Pour 1 1/2 cups water over 1 cup of oatmeal. Let stand while mixing other ingredient. Cream together: butter, brown sugar and white sugar, Add beaten eggs, vanilla. Add oats, salt, sifted flour, soda and cinnamon. Bake in flat pan at 350 degrees for 30 to 35 minutes. Just about 5 minutes before cake is done add frosting.

FROSTING

1/2 stick margarine ("I can't believe it")3 tbsp. of milk3/4 cup brown sugar

1 cup nuts

1 can of coconut

Spread on cake, bake 5 minutes more.
