



January 13, 2012

**Deaf Seniors of Texas** (DST) is official as of January 11, 2012 as a non-profit information resources agency serving all deaf/hard-of-hearing senior citizens in the State of Texas without regard to race, religion, sex, disability or nationality.

The purpose of the DST is to provide central, cooperative and coordinated assistance and services and to assist them with independent living and promote the overall well-being of all deaf/hard-of hearing senior citizens:

- 1. To promote awareness of special needs for deaf/hard-of-hearing senior citizens in the State of Texas.
- 2. To encourage/coordinate with the establishment of local deaf/hard-of-hearing senior-citizen organizations.
- 3. To promote the overall well-being of deaf/hard-of-hearing senior citizens through local organizations:
  - a. To keep them from being isolated or homebound.
  - b. To assist them with the independent living.
  - c. To promote leisure activities for challenging mental alertness.
  - d. To give them opportunities for social interaction and enjoyment.
- 4. To sponsor/host symposium whenever possible dealing with issues impacting their well-being and safety.
- To acquaint those deaf/hard-of-hearing senior citizens with national, state, and local resources that will contribute to their positive image and fuller participation in the mainstream society.
- 6. To advocate the rights of deaf/hard-of-hearing senior citizens.

The initial DST directors are Don Hahn of Houston, Mack Harris of Arlington and Earl Day of Buda. The board size will grow to nine when the drafted bylaws are adopted.

There will be no members and only the board will run and make all decisions.

There will be no newsletter but periodic press release will be Issued.

There will be a website called www.deafseniorsoftexas.org.

She enjoyed doing arts and crafts, sewing and was an excellent gardener; however, her greatest joy was being a wonderful, loving mother and grandmother. Mildred is preceded in death by her parents; her late husband, Maurice LeBlanc; a granddaughter, Janell Pinner and 3 sisters. She is survived by a son, Maurice LeBlanc, Jr. of Houston; a

daughter, Becky Robinson and husband Harold of Conroe and a granddaughter, Brandi DeLao and husband Joseph and daughter Kristen. Donald Horace Bradford
January 10, 1927 – January 22, 2012



Donald Horace Bradford, 85, of Kyle, Texas passed away on Sunday, January 22nd in Kyle, TX. He was born in Graham, Texas on January 10, 1927 to Horace and Mattie (White) Bradford. Mr. Bradford is survived by his loving wife of 27 years, Linda; from his first marriage to Rosalind Sommers, daughter, Donna Sibray and her husband, Steven of Scottsbluff, NE; son, Philip Bradford and his wife, Mindy of Albuquerque, NM; grandson, Jonathan Sibray and his wife, Kim of Edgewood, NM; granddaughter, Tamara Sibray of Laramie, WY; and great-grandson, Nathan Sibray of Edgewood, NM.

He was preceded in death by his sister, Cara Hamscher. Don grew up in El Paso and at age 10, he lost both his hearing and sight from spinal meningitis. Luckily, his sight returned within a few months. His father encouraged him to be independent and took him on many excursions including participating in parades and campouts with the Sheriff's posse group of which his father was a member. With one of his uncles being a pilot, Don took an interest in flying and became one of the first deaf licensed pilots at age 18 logging over 10,000 hours over his lifetime.

Don's love of sports drew him to the Texas School for the Deaf in Austin where he was a member of the National Deaf Prep Champion football team and became a cadet officer in the school's Cadet Corps working up to the rank of captain. After graduation in 1944, he went on to graduate from Gallaudet University in 1949 with a B.S. degree. Don delighted fellow students with airplane rides over the Gallaudet campus. Upon completing some graduate courses, Don accepted a position to teach and coach at the New Mexico School for the Deaf in Santa Fe. In two years. Don's mathematical skills led him to a career change from teaching to an opening working with computers at Los Alamos National Laboratory in Los Alamos, New Mexico. As a data analyst, he participated in the 'Maniac' project which developed one of the world's first 'electric brains'. He also co-authored the MADCAP language used in programming for the 'Maniac' project and went overseas for bombing tests.

He retired after 36 of service. In his leisure time, Don's first love was flying. He became a check pilot for the New Mexico Wing of the Civil Air Patrol. He also loved sharing outdoor activities with his wife, Linda and family such as golfing, boating, fishing, camping, and skiing. Oftentimes, one would find Don and his wife out camping every other weekend with friends, hearing and deaf alike. There was a special place in his heart for all kids and dogs and he had a smile and a hug for everyone. Don was a tireless advocate for the deaf both in the workplace and community. He served on various committees and received numerous awards one of which was the Amos Kendall award from Gallaudet which honors a deaf person for notable excellence in a professional field not related to deafness. # Alice Rhea Wright

# **Chuck Baird**

Febuary 22, 1947 – February 10, 2012

Chuck Baird, who was born on February 22, 1947,



attended Kansas School for the Deaf, Gallaudet College (now Gallaudet University), and Rochester Institute of Technology. Upon completing his education, Chuck spent five summers at National Theatre of the Deaf (NTD) as set carpenter and painter. He also did various jobs developing his art in Upstate New York and Delaware. He then moved to Austin, Texas,

to become a member of Spectrum which was nicknamed a "deaf art colony" from the late 70s to the early 80s. In 1980, Chuck became an actor and set designer for NTD for 10 years. Had the lead role in three plays: "Heart of a Lonely Hunter," "King of Hearts," and "One More Spring." After his tenure at NTD, he lived in California and Arizona performing at local theaters. He then worked for DawnSignPress, a San Diego-based publishing company, as an in-house artist creating a number of Deaf-related works which culminated in a coffee-table book containing 35 plates of his work. He then went back to Kansas City and Tucson running his own painting studios. During this time, he traveled to paint murals or lead art workshops for deaf children at schools, summer camps, and art festivals. His work led to the creation of a new art genre called Deaf View Image Art (DeÂ'VIA) with numerous art exhibits all over the world. Gallaudet appointed Chuck to help coordinate the visual arts exhibitions for Deaf Way II in 2002. He also taught art there for one semester. Chuck then relocated to Austin, Texas where he continued his work until his passing on February 10, 2012. ### RECIPE

### Italian Style Meat Loaf

By Beth Strain

- 1 egg
- 1 ½ pound lean ground beef or turkey
- 8 ounces hot or mild Italian sausage, casings removed
- 1 cup CONTADINA Seasoned Tomato Sauce, divided
- 1 cup finely chopped onion½ cup finely, chopped green bell pepper
- 1. Beat egg lightly in large bowl, Add beef, sausage, Bread crumbs, ¼ cup tomato sauce, onion and bell pepper; mix well.
- Press into ungreased 9x5 inch loaf pan. Bake, uncovered, in preheated 350F oven for 60 minutes.
- Spoon remaining tomato sauce over meat loaf, Bake 15 minutes longer or until no longer pink in center; drain. Let stand for 10 minutes before serving. Making 8 servings


