

AUSTIN'S OWN DEAF MASTER OF ARTS AND CRAFTS

Glenn Brunson (1959) is Austin's own deaf master of arts and crafts. He is involved in nearly everything creative. He publishes the newsletters for the Travis Association of the Deaf-Senior Citizens, collects news, and does the layout. This is no small feat! He has done a variety of arts and crafts, such as oil painting, but the hobby that fascinates most people is doll making.

Glenn retired about 16 years ago from the Travis County Courthouse where he was a microfilm supervisor. His sister convinced him to go to doll making classes in San Antonio with her for about a year, and learn how to make porcelain dolls. He became so interested in these classes. He bought his own kiln. He can order molds from doll catalogs, make the dolls, paint the faces down to the last detail, and attach wigs. The dolls vary from 12 inches to 36 inches. They can be made to look like specific people.

Barbara Brunson, his wife, sews elaborate outfits for the dolls. She pays great attention to the time period and cultural style. Some of the costumes are from the 1800's such as the one for a Scarlett O'Hara doll. She has made Indian doll outfits for their American Indian collection. One doll, for example, has silver and turquoise beads, a leather skirt, a long skirt, and moccasins. She also has made special outfits for other dolls that Glenn has made such a Shirley Temple and an Arabian doll.



Barbara also collects Barbie dolls. With the many dolls that Glenn has made and those she collects, they

have had over 300 dolls. Some they have sold. Some have been given away.

But they keep many of them and will be happy to show you some. Glenn now has other hobbies and volunteer activities that take up his time so he doesn't make dolls very often these days. But he is still working on Cleopatra doll.

Currently, he supervises a group of volunteers at the TSD Heritage Center Museum and helps set up exhibits. He set up a Back to School exhibit recently with nice decorative touches. He also serves as the treasurer for the Travis Association of the Deaf-Senior Citizens in addition to publishing the newsletter. He is a very busy person but he always has a big smile and time to talk with anyone.







RECIPE

BIRDIE CAKE

- 2 eggs
- 1/2 cup water to make a full cup
- 2 cup flour
- 2 cup sugar
- 1 tsp vanilla
- 2 tsp. baking soda
- 1 can crushed pineapple (Don't drain)
- Butter pan

Bake 350 till slightly brown or test tooth pick first or to see the cake if done. 35 to 40 minutes.
