

ANITA UGARTE DALLA'S SEASHELL

In 1900, Anita's Uncle Luis and aunt Anita Ortiz were vacationing in Galveston, when the "Galveston Hurricane" hit the city with storm tide surges up to 15 feet, killing 8,000+ people. Women stayed at the church for safety, while men helped with search and rescue. After the city had calmed down in a week's time, Luis returned to Anita, bearing a large seashell he found on the beach, which had washed ashore during the high tides. Anita Ortiz lost all her jewelry in the storm and thus vowed never to visit Galveston again.

Fifteen years later, they returned to Galveston, curious about the newer and improved city, As fate would have it, the city was again struck by a very bad storm, with storm surges up to 12 feet above normal. Anita Ortiz again lost some jewelry, so they never returned to Galveston again. Years later, Anita Ortiz gave this seashell to Alma Hines Ugarte who passed it down to her daughter, Anita Ugarte Dalla.

RECIPE

The Best Baked Corn

- 2 Tbsp flour
